Mobeen H. Rathore, MD, CPE, FAAP, FPIDS, FIDSA, FSHEA, FACPE, is a 25-year member (life member) and immediate Past President of the Florida Chapter of the AAP (FCAAP). He is the Editor of *Florida Pediatrician* and has revamped this FCAAP journal. He started the very successful FCAAP Annual meeting. As President he made the chapter financially strong and even created a reserve fund. Mobeen has been very active in organized medicine and has served on the boards of HIV Medical Association and Pediatric Infectious Diseases Society. He is the past President of Duval County Medical Society and is running unopposed for board of Governors of the Florida Medical Association.

Dr. Rathore is very active in the AAP and serves on the Red Book Committee and Executive Committee of the Section on IMGs. He has participated in several AAP task forces including for HIV in Adolescents and H1N1 Disaster Preparedness. He is editorial board member, currently of *Pediatrics in Review* and in the past of AAP Grand Rounds. Mobeen is also member of the sub-board of pediatric infectious diseases of the American Board of Pediatrics and is the Founding Director of pediatric infectious diseases fellowship in Jacksonville

A fervent advocate for all children and especially children with HIV he has been instrumental in the improvement of HIV care of children and pregnant women in the State of Florida. He is the Medical Director of Children's Medical Service for Northeast Florida.

Dr. Rathore is Chief of pediatric infectious diseases at Wolfson Children's Hospital and University of Florida (UF), and Professor and Associate Chair, UF College of Medicine, Jacksonville. He is the Founding Director of UF Center for HIV/AIDS Research, Education and Service. Mobeen has served on the boards of Wolfson Children's Hospital and UF Jacksonville practice plan.

Dr. Rathore has not only closed the "town and gown" gap in medicine, he is very active in the community serving on the boards of OneJax (a diversity/inclusion advocacy organization) and Environmental Protection Board. He is President of the board of MASS free clinic for the uninsured and President-elect of Leadership Jacksonville.
