

Regional Representative

Regional Representatives are governing members of the Board of Directors. Regional Representatives shall serve a two-year term from the time of their election.

The Bylaws set forth the responsibilities and duties of Regional Representatives:

- Regional Representatives shall be responsible for providing two-way communication between the Region and the leadership of the organization utilizing the Executive Committee and the Board of Directors;*
- Regional Representatives shall be responsible for providing reports to the Board of Directors on regional activities and needs;*
- Regional Representatives shall be available for appointment to Committees/Task Forces of the organization;*
- Regional Representatives may be requested by the President to be the organization's local representative to the media when issues of importance arise;*
- Regional Representatives shall promote membership in the organization and propose recruitment and retention campaigns;*
- Regional Representatives shall serve as ambassadors to non-members and convey information regarding the initiatives, goals and missions of the organization;*
- Regional Representatives shall be available to respond to issues regarding health and welfare of infants, children, adolescents and young adults in Florida; and coordinate national and local resources when possible.*

All regional representatives are expected to attend, either in person or by teleconference, all regularly scheduled meetings of the board. Board members must attend more than 50% of meetings in any 12-month period of time.

FCAAP is composed of geographic Regions, designated numerically 1 through 8. Each region is represented by one regional representative and one alternate representative, with the exception of Regions 7 and 8 which each have two alternate representatives.
